0 – 500	Colonial European colonization, introduction of iron, written documents
500 – 3 000	Woodland Sedentarization, development of pottery and adoption of corn
3 000 – 8 000	Archaic Regional adaptations, land and sea mammal hunting
8 000 – 12 000	Paleoindian End of the ice age, peopling of the territory, megafauna hunting
