| 0 – 500 | Colonial European colonization, introduction of iron, written documents |
| 500 – 3 000 | Woodland Sedentarization, development of pottery and adoption of corn |
| 3 000 – 8 000 | Archaic Regional adaptations, land and sea mammal hunting |
| 8 000 – 12 000 | Paleoindian End of the ice age, peopling of the territory, megafauna hunting |
